Test the Connection: Verify internet access and performance using network testing tools or by checking connectivity on connected devices.

Router Upgrade: If your current router does not support fiber directly, you can still use it with an ONT. For higher speeds, consider upgrading to a router that supports gigabit Ethernet or Wi-Fi 6.

Cable Management: Fiber cables are delicate; avoid bending beyond the minimum bend radius and ensure connectors are properly aligned and locked.
