Connect wires to the correct terminals: Phase wires to the MCB (Miniature Circuit Breaker) or main isolator. Neutral wires to the neutral bus bar. Ground wires to the earth bus bar, which should be connected to a proper earth rod or pit. Use approved wire connectors (wire nuts or terminal blocks) to secure splices. Ensure connections are tight and no bare wire is exposed outside the connector. Label each wire and circuit for future maintenance and troubleshooting.

Final Checks Perform a visual inspection to ensure no wires are touching each other or the metal enclosure. Test the connections with a multimeter before restoring power. Close the distribution box securely and ensure all covers are in place.
