16 (B) (1) requires each conductor that originates outside the box and terminates or is spliced within the box to be counted once, and each conductor passing through the box without splice or termination is also counted once. 16 (B) provides volume allowances to be used when calculating the number of 18 AWG through 6 AWG conductors permitted in a box. This process is a safety requirement mandated by electrical codes, such as Article 314. Overstuffing a box can lead to damaged wire insulation, excessive heat buildup, and an increased risk of fire or short circuits. Article 314 applies to: These. NEC Section 314. 29 requires that you be able to reach the wiring inside by simply removing a cover plate or access panel. Inspectors check box fill, and they should. It's one of the most common code violations in residential work, especially.
