The standard fiber strand sequence is blue, orange, green, brown, slate, white, red, black, yellow, violet, rose and aqua. Cable jacket colors usually identify the fiber type: yellow for OS1/OS2 single-mode, orange for OM1/OM2 multimode, aqua for OM3, aqua or violet for OM4.
