

Reserved length for cable tray hangers



Overview

The distance between hangers should typically not exceed 1.5 meters, although this can vary depending on the tray type and load. Fixed supports are critical for the overall stability and safety of the cable tray system. 8 (Other Mechanical Stresses (A)) in that document provides requirements for cable support. The NEC requires that cable trays must be supported by members at an interval specified by the cable tray manufacturer, but not more than 5 feet for horizontal runs to support the weight of the cables and other loads. The rungs cannot be more.
