It distributes power to branch circuits, which can feed motors, machinery, or lighting systems in commercial or industrial buildings (). In large buildings or construction sites, multiple SDBs may be installed to ensure localized control and protection, forming a hierarchical distribution system: primary → secondary → tertiary distribution boxes (). Safety and Operational Considerations Each SDB is designed to maintain selectivity and protection, ensuring that faults in one branch do not affect other circuits (). The principle of “one device, one circuit breaker, one residual current device, one box” is often applied to prevent overloads and electrical hazards ().
