

Spacing between two layers of cable tray supports



AI Overview

For double-layer cable trays, the typical support spacing ranges from 1.5 to 3 meters for horizontal runs, with vertical spacing between trays of at least 150 millimeters, and a minimum horizontal separation of 0.6 meters between parallel trays.

Horizontal Support Spacing For straight horizontal runs, cable tray supports should generally be placed every 1.5 to 3 meters depending on the tray type, load, and manufacturer specifications. Heavier or long-span trays may require closer spacing to prevent sagging and maintain structural integrity, while lighter trays can span longer distances between supports. At corners, bends, or T-junctions, supports should be installed on each side to stabilize the tray and prevent stress on the cables.

Vertical Spacing Between Trays When installing double-layer trays, the minimum vertical clearance between the trays should be 150 millimeters. This ensures adequate airflow for heat dissipation, allows for maintenance access, and prevents obstruction when adding or rearranging cables in the future.

Horizontal Separation Between Parallel Trays If two trays are installed side by side at the same height, the minimum horizontal distance between them should be 0.6 meters. This spacing facilitates inspection, maintenance, and proper ventilation, while reducing the risk of cables touching or causing interference.

Additional Considerations Supports should be fixed at key points such as the start and end of the tray, corners, and spans longer than 30 meters. Hanging rod supports should have a minimum diameter of 8 millimeters, and fixed supports should be attached to structural beams for stability. For vertical or angled runs, supports should be spaced preferably less than 2 meters to secure the trays and cables.
