- Near joints or bends:** Supports should be placed within 150 mm of tray joints or changes in direction to ensure stability.

Installation Tips

- Use two bolts per bracket for secure attachment to cantilever or pendant supports.
- For ceiling-mounted trays, additional threaded rod suspensions may be required for longer brackets or heavier loads.
- Always consider the cable type, weight, and environmental factors when selecting bracket length and spacing to avoid deflection or excessive sag.
