- 5. Faulty Load or GFCI/AFCI Protection** Sometimes the issue is downstream: a faulty appliance, sensor, or GFCI/AFCI outlet can prevent power from being delivered. Test the circuit with a known working device or bypass the load temporarily to isolate the problem.
